LEARNING AND TEACHING

Our school has two phases of education; Junior Secondary for students in Years 7-9 and Senior Secondary for Years 10-12. During the Senior Secondary phase of learning, students have an opportunity to choose either an academic and/or vocational program. The curriculum is based on eight key learning areas and enhanced in Years 11 and 12 with a choice of 35 subjects (registered with the Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority), as well as Australian Quality Training certificates.

The Australian Curriculum describes what young Australians should learn as they progress through schooling. It is the foundation for their future learning, growth and active participation in the Australian community. It sets out essential knowledge, understanding, skills and capabilities and provides a national standard for student achievement in core learning areas.

Junior Secondary

The Year 7, 8 and 9 curriculum is delivered through eight Key Learning Areas (KLAs) to ensure students receive a challenging, engaging and comprehensive education.

Senior Secondary

In Senior Secondary, Merrimac continues to deliver quality academic programs, offering students various pathways to tertiary education, industry or employment.

Students can focus exclusively on tertiary entrance rankings (ATAR) or they may choose to explore and negotiate a range of career options tailored to individual learning needs.

Year 10 is part of the Senior Phase of Learning and subjects taken in this year level will inform students' course of study in Years 11 and 12.

We offer four different types of subjects in Years 11 and 12: General, Applied, Industry Pathway and School-based subjects.

QCAA General Subjects are approved by the Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority (QCAA), are recorded on the Senior Education Profile and will contribute towards a student's Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE). Many of the General subjects are academically demanding.

QCAA Applied subjects are also registered by the QCAA. They have QCAA approved study plans and focus on a strong vocational educational core. They are also recorded on the Senior Education Profile and contribute towards a student's QCE. Applied subjects place more emphasis on practical skills and knowledge and are designed to develop specific skills relevant to employment and real-life.

Industry Pathway/School-based subjects provide pathways to vocational education certificates and are offered through the school in conjunction with a Registered Training Organisation. These subjects provide industry standard qualifications. Each subject offered through this process will have a direct industry association and will often incorporate a compulsory work placement.

Selective Entry Summit Program

At Merrimac, we believe that fostering student interests and providing opportunities for growth allows students to reach their highest potential.

Our Selective Entry Summit program provides students with opportunities for academic, sporting and cultural extension, enabling students to thrive in their chosen area of interest. Places in our various Summit Programs are limited, therefore only students with passion, commitment and high levels of performance are selected.

Students may apply for entry into the programs listed below. Our Leadership Program can also be undertaken in conjunction with the student's chosen program.

Academic Summit: an innovative academic curriculum that fosters a higher order and critical thinking approach to deep learning and accelerates students' understanding of the world around them; including social, political and environmental issues.

Dance Summit: an engaging course that focuses on practical activities relating to the dance industry, consequently developing a strong technical foundation across a broad spectrum of dance. The program has an increased emphasis on choreography skills, industry awareness and professionalism.

Sport Summit: a dynamic, generalised sporting excellence program that emphasises attitude and mindset as much as physical ability. Students participate in a wide variety of physical performance activities designed to promote improvement of specific physical/mental capacities and attributes, test and improve personal fitness levels and build team work and communication skills.

STEAM Academy: a stream of learning that develops skills commonly used in Science, Technology, Enterprise, the Arts and Mathematics. The STEAM Academy allows students to design, develop and evaluate their own solutions in a project-based learning environment. The program brings digital and design technologies together with problem-solving skills to foster higher-order thinking.

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Special Education Program

We are proud to have one of the Gold Coast's premium Special Education Programs, with more than 100 students currently enrolled.

Special Education is available to those students who have physical, intellectual, visual, hearing or speech impairments, and/ or Autistic Spectrum Disorders. All verified Special Education students have an Education Adjustment Profile and engage in a program where the goal is for the students to become active participants in the wider community.

Core subjects focus on work experience, community access, literacy, numeracy and socialisation skills. Students also participate in mainstream elective subjects.

Students in the program can obtain either a Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) or Queensland Certificate of Individual Achievement (QCIA).

The Special Education Programs department is based in our newly refurbished Special Education building, which features eight state-of-the-art classrooms, a sensory room, a bright meeting space, a kitchen and reception.

All rooms are also fitted with hearing augmentation systems, Braille signage, ducted air and dimmable lighting.



STUDENT LEADERSHIP

Merrimac State High School encourages all students to participate in the extensive leadership opportunities available in both the Junior Secondary and Senior Secondary School. Students can apply to participate in our specialised leadership program, which has been specifically designed to develop character and leadership capabilities.

Leaders at Merrimac uphold a culture of service to others by being aware of their community's needs, modelling an attitude that is optimistic and proactive, and being committed to enact positive change through their actions. Our student leaders understand their social responsibility and are encouraged to volunteer in the wider community. It is expected that nominated leaders model exemplary behaviour and uphold our school values of Respect, Responsibility and Reliability to the highest degree.

A wide range of leadership opportunities are available for all students from Year 7 to Year 12. These include: Phoenix Leader (Y7-9), Junior School Captain (Y9), LEO's Leaders (Y9), Peer Mentors (Y10), International Mentors (Y10), You Can Sit With Me (Y10), Student Council Executives (Y11), Indigenous Student Leaders (Y12), Prefects (Y12), House Captains (Y12) and School Captains (Y12).









Wellbeing

Under the direction of the Head of Leadership and Wellbeing, along with our Year Level Deans, we prioritise student wellbeing through the fully integrated Wellbeing Program, Merrimac Minds Matter.

The program aims to develop protective factors amongst our students through the promotion, prevention and early intervention of mental health.

Each week students participate in the timetabled wellbeing class, Merrimac Minds Matter, which engages our young people in relevant and meaningful discussions with Phoenix teachers to build relationships, develop resilience and practise mindfulness.

This program has also been designed specifically for the needs of our students after site specific data collection identified peaks in particular student concerns and interventions offered in support. As a result, schoolwide term focus units have been established, finding opportunities to develop greater consistency in our student wellbeing approach and engaging our community in positive education.

INTERNATIONAL FOCUS

With multiculturalism and global citizenship at the heart of our ethos, we warmly welcome international students and are proud to offer an enriching local homestay courtesy of our strong engagement with the school community.

Our current student body - representing 42 nationalities - reflects the diverse cultural make up of our school, and includes international students from China, Japan, Brazil, Germany, Norway, Hong Kong, Taiwan and beyond.

As they undertake a challenging academic education, international students experience an enriching cultural immersion through experiences such as a trip to Cairns and Central Queensland, a multi-night stay a Numinbah Valley, a day-trip to one of the Gold Coast's













Sports

Merrimac has a long history of valuing physical activity and promoting overall physical and mental wellbeing. All students from Years 7-12 are encouraged to participate in sport and also utilise the school's extensive sporting facilities during their breaks.

Danza



Coordinated by the Student Representative Council (SRC), our multicultural night is a long-standing tradition that we value. This celebrated event invites students and members of the wider community to showcase their cultures through the arts and food.

STUDENT SUPPORT

In line with our school philosophy and approach to collective wellbeing, Merrimac is proud to employ an array of staff to assist with student support.

Students can utilise support services from: Guidance Officers, Deans, Psychologists, School Based Youth Health Nurse, Head of Positive Behaviour, Chaplain, Social Worker and Industry Liaison Officer.

Academic support

In addition to welfare support, students are able to receive academic support throughout their schooling here at Merrimac.

The **Lift Program**, available to students in Years 7-9, is designed to provide identified students with additional support in developing essential Literacy and Numeracy skills necessary to successfully engage with the curriculum.

Literacy: In lieu of studying another language, students in the Lift Program will engage in skill-based activities which support the improvement of reading comprehension, spelling and written communication.

Numeracy: During their scheduled Mathematics lesson, students will work in small groups to improve the areas of knowledge that may be hindering their development. The Mathematics Department utilises Waypoints diagnostic testing to identify students with deficits in knowledge that require addressing beyond the regular classroom setting.





Respect Responsibility Reliability
